To graduate complete all major requirements, Foundations, and electives needed for 124 hour minimum bachelor's degree requirement or 60 hour minimum associate degree requirement and must pass chapel. Students with waivers of Foundations requirement must still meet the minimum credits required for graduation. **Completion of Cross Cultural Immersion must be documented to graduate with the bachelor's degree.
