The Art Grades P–12 Major includes a battery of courses provided by the School of Education, which is approved and accredited by the Kentucky Education Professional Standards Board, and accredited by the Council for the Accreditation of Educator Preparation (CAEP). This degree adequately prepares the student for teacher certification in Kentucky.

To graduate must complete all major requirements, foundational requirements, and additional electives needed for 124 hour minimum degree requirement.
