

Using Your Health Insurance For Healthcare and Immunizations

Asbury Health Services Clinic:

Asbury University Health Services Clinic provides **FREE** medical care for currently enrolled students, regardless of any health insurance coverage. We should be your *first stop* for medical care while you are here. However, there may be times when you will need to seek care elsewhere (i.e. when Health Services is closed or for a service we don't provide).

Treatment for Illness or Injury Off Campus:

When you seek care elsewhere (ER, Urgent Care, medical offices, etc.) **these services are NOT FREE even with insurance.** You must present a copy of your insurance card and a photo ID at time of service and you will be billed accordingly. Before using your Asbury insurance, you will need to establish an account and print a copy of your insurance card from the insurance website. With the Asbury Health Insurance you will be responsible to pay the yearly deductible, any copays and/or 20% of costs after you have met your deductible. For other private health insurance companies call the number on back of your card.

Preventative Care:

Asbury University Student Health Insurance Plan and most private health insurance plans* cover **PREVENTATIVE** care/services for **FREE** without a copay or meeting your deductible (immunizations, physical exams, etc.).

Immunizations:

Many pharmacies and clinics offer vaccines. It's best to contact the pharmacy or clinic before you go to be sure they accept your insurance and have the vaccine(s) you need on hand. Take a copy of any immunizations you have already received, your insurance card and a photo ID to the pharmacy or clinic that accepts your insurance. They will give you the immunization(s) and bill your insurance, so you likely will not have to pay anything. This includes vaccines such as FLU, Tetanus, MMR, Hepatitis A and B, Meningitis, etc., and even some vaccines for overseas travel.

In the Asbury area the closest pharmacy that normally has these vaccines in stock and can bill the Asbury Student Insurance is:
