AUHP Summative Experience (1 credit)

AUHP students will undertake a project or experience, typically within the last four semesters as an undergraduate student, which reflects individual work performed within the student's major area of study. The work performed should be the product of the AUHP student, judged to be of high quality (as determined by departmental faculty or some appropriate vetting mechanism), and publicly presented or displayed on campus (e.g., SEARCH, Highbridge Film Festival, art exhibit, recital, theatrical performance, departmental meeting) or at an appropriate off-campus academic or professional setting. These experiences can be one of the following:

- ➤ SEARCH Submission: An AUHP student will submit, under the guidance of a supervising professor from their major area of study, a research project to SEARCH. A project paper will be submitted into the competition and the student will generate a corresponding poster presentation to be displayed during the annual SEARCH symposium and celebration.
- Creative Product Generation: An AUHP student, under the guidance of a supervising professor from their major area of study, will be the primary creator of a creative product (e.g., student film, physical artifact or work of art, musical composition, theatrical production). (The determination of "primary creator" will be judged by departmental faculty.) The product will be vetted departmentally and publicly displayed on campus (e.g., Highbridge Film Festival, art exhibit, recital, theatrical performance).

A dean or department chair may propose that the following option be made available:

➤ Internship or service project: An AUHP student, under the guidance of a supervising professor from their major area of study, will be involved in an internship, practicum, or community leadership project (either an experience not already required by the major or an expanded version of an experience that is required) in a venue related to the AUHP student's chosen field of study or profession. The sponsoring department will provide a venue (within the department or more broadly) for the student to present a summary of their experience.

Students' Summative work may be registered as an independent study with a professor in the discipline either using a course number associated with that discipline (ex PSY436 Research) or as Honors___465 designation.

The AUHP directors may request via Curriculog that the successful completion of any of the above options serve to waive this 1-credit AUHP component.
